

Position Announcement (Reopened Search):
New Editor-in-Chief for *Veterinary Clinical Pathology*

The ASVCP is again soliciting expressions of interest from members in the United States or Canada for the position of **Editor-in-Chief** of *Veterinary Clinical Pathology*. The current editor, Dr. Karen Young, will soon retire from the journal. To ensure a smooth transition, the ASVCP seeks to appoint a successor on or before January 1, 2012.

Veterinary Clinical Pathology is the leading international journal in its field and the official journal of the ASVCP and ESVCP. An increasingly competitive publication, the journal accepts ~35% of the more than 200 manuscripts submitted each year while maintaining excellent turnaround on initial decision. The journal's 2010 impact factor is 1.239.

The editor is responsible for managing the peer-review process and is solely responsible for the scientific content of the journal. The editor must have an intimate knowledge of the field; familiarity with major researchers, institutions, and resources; and a desire to set the standard for intellectual rigor in the discipline. The editor should be comfortable working in an electronic editorial environment and must have a proven ability to meet and enforce deadlines, strong interpersonal skills, and an interest in facilitating a high quality publication.

Candidates should be a veterinarian with clinical laboratory experience and a strong record of published research as primary author. A PhD in a relevant discipline and a current faculty appointment are preferred. Previous experience as an editor is not required. A 5-year commitment is preferred.

Interested applicants should submit a CV along with a 1-2 page statement that describes their personal and professional goals, relevant experience, a vision for the journal, and the names and contact information for 3 references.
